
## Holiday Party Dec. 9!

Our January 5 Membership Meeting will feature local historian Bob Hazelton, who will give a presentation titled, "The History of Spring Creek Canyon".

Bob Hazelton is a retired Electrical Engineer. He is on the boards of the Centre County Historical and Genealogical Societies and focuses his research on "lost" civilization in the local area. He is also a member and works on projects for ClearWater and the Bald Eagle Archaeological Society.

Bob's presentation will cover:

- General Philip Benner and the establishment of the iron operation at Rock
- Harvey Mann's axe factory - an extension of his operation at Boiling Springs, (now Axemann). on the Logan Branch of Spring Creek
- The acquisition of the Benner/Mann lands by Major William F. Reynolds and its later ownership by his nephew, Colonel Fred W. Reynolds
- The sale of the land to the Western Pennsylvania Correctional Institution at Rockview
- The evolution of Fishermen's Paradise.

The meeting will be held in the first floor conference room at the Comfort Suites State College starting at 7:30 p.m. and is free and open to all.

## **Upcoming Programs**

Our presenter for the February 2 Membership meeting will be Don Bastian, who will give a fly tying demonstration on classic wet flies and streamers. Many of you know Don is an extremely talented fly tyer, particularly for traditional wet flies. If you have ever admired the flies that are featured in Ray Bergman's "Trout" book, Don tied all of those, plus more. For us, he will be tying traditional winged wet flies, including old-time married wing patterns. He also plans to tie a Carrie Stevens streamer pattern and demonstrate her method of cementing the wing components together. Part of the display he is bringing to the meeting will be coordinated to include Rangeley Style Maine streamer patterns.

The meeting will be held in the first floor conference room at the Comfort Suites State College starting at 7:30 p.m. Free and open to all.

Owen Welch is the "poster boy" for youth involvement in Trout Unlimited.

He caught his first trout with a fly when he was about 10 years old, during a "First Cast" field trip to Fisherman's Paradise, sponsored by the Spring Creek Chapter of Trout Unlimited and Centre Region Parks and Recreation. He remembers Dan Shields teaching the kids to cast during that camp and he loved all the field trips. He says he owes his fishing skills to his parents and to Trout Unlimited. He was introduced to bait fishing at age 4, by his dad and grandpa. By age 8, he got curious about fly fishing, so his family, not being fly fishing people, did the next best thing and gave him a fly tying kit. At age 10, they enrolled him in the First Cast camp in State College. They took him to the Penns Creek TU Chapter banquet where he won the raffle "Kids Fish for a Day with Larry Winey."

Owen says, "Without that TU guy who took me fly fishing and my parents who sent me to the First Cast camp, I wouldn't be where I am today in the world of fly fishing."

Today, at age 17, Owen's fly fishing world includes being a member of the US Youth Fly Fishing Team. That team won the gold medal in world competition in Italy this summer. And speaking of the US Youth Fly Fishing team... as if the Penns Creek Chapter, with Gary Parzanese as president, doesn't have enough to brag about by helping Owen, they can also boast to having Adam Pickets, Spencer Miller, and Kyle Winey as TU chapter members. All four of these young men have been on the US Youth Fly Fishing Team over the years. Owen says he got most of his appreciation for stream conservation from his regular attendance at TU meetings.

He has one more feather in his cap -or is it in his fly tying box - that is 1.5 university credits from Penn State University. Both his mom and dad work on the PSU campus. Someone showed Owen's mom a video of a fly fishing course offered at Penn State. One week later Owen's dad ran into Mark Belden, who teaches the fly fishing classes at Penn State. Belden is another big advocate of teaching kids to fish and appreciate the environment that goes with fishing. He is also a very active member of the Spring Creek TU Chapter.

Mark told Owen's dad about the summer fly fishing basics class. After some arranging with Lewistown High School, Owen took the course for credit. You better believe that the college students were pretty impressed when they learned that Owen was only 14 at the time.

He didn't stop with just learning for himself. For three summers, he
