

Youth camp scholarship available

Each year Trout Unlimited sponsors a youth fly fishing camp in Boiling Springs (near Harrisburg) at the Allenberry Resort Inn. The 2013 Rivers Conservation and Fly Fishing Youth Camp will be held June 16 to 21.

The Spring Creek Chapter of Trout Unlimited has \$250 budgeted to assist a youth to attend this camp. The cost for tuition, room and board is \$350. The camp is co-ed for ages 14 to 17 (applicants must have been born between June 21, 1995 and June 16, 1999) Fly fishing equipment is available for loan if needed. Campers receive all course materials, a vest, camp tee shirt, hat, and flies. There are 10 fishing sessions on the catch and release section of the Yellow Breeches held prior to breakfast and after dinner each day.

Classes are taught by more than 25 different instructors, all experts in their field.

Looking back over the past year, I think we can be very proud of our accomplishments as a chapter and proud of the people who make this chapter work.

Let's start with fundraising. The banquet is our cornerstone for operational expenses. **Jim Purtell** and his committee did a great job putting it all together, giving us a fun



night, and making it a profitable evening. He and his crew are now primed and ready for April 6, 2013 at the Mountain View Country Club (formerly the Elks Country Club) for our 40th Anniversary celebration.

In June of 2012 we participated in the first "Centre Gives" fundraiser run by the Centre Foundation. That netted us \$2,800. Not bad for a 36 hour internet event. We'll do that again in 2013 and better our numbers. In September of 2012 we were one of four organizations who participated in and will be the recipient of funds collected from the State College Rotary Club's annual sandwich sale. Those proceeds will purchase equipment and materials for our youth programs. Thanks to **Rick Van Horn** for setting up the introduction to the Rotary Club.

The big feather in our cap was the \$69,800 grant we were awarded by National Fish and Wildlife Foundation (NFWF) in August 2012. This Small Watershed Grant was provided by the Chesapeake Bay Stewardship Fund. **Bob Vierck** was extremely instrumental in getting that grant proposal to press and he is now our main man on the ground seeing that the job gets done. Spring 2013 will see us working on the lower McCoy Dam area in Milesburg followed by the parking lots at Fisherman's Paradise and "The Rock."

Let's look at individuals who have given so many hours to this chapter in 2012 plus many years before that. **Bill Brusse** was president of this chapter for at least 5 years and gave many years of his expert advice to our conservation causes. **Chris Haser** stepped down as a board member but will remain our Stream Clean-Up organizer (April 20, 2013), as well as the chapter's coordinator of the PATU youth program called Wayne's Coldwater Kids (April 28, 2013). He will always be our Spring Creek Chapter ambassador holding court at Fisherman's Paradise. **Chris Hennessey** is and will remain our excellent Tertiary Treatment newsletter editor even though he has stepped down from the board. He will continue to help us with projects from time to time and be our go to guy for news and advertising advice.

There is one more man that deserves a standing ovation. That guy is **Al Phillips**. 
